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## Application Procedure

- Applications for admission to Concordia Academy-Bloomington are accepted beginning September 1st for the following academic year.
- Admission requirements for the **junior high** include a completed application with registration fee, a completed "Parent Questionnaire," and a family interview with a Concordia Academy administrator. Copies of standardized test scores, report cards from 5th grade to the present, and copies of any special assessments, accommodation plans, etc are also required.
- Admission requirements for the **high school** include a completed application; a completed recommendation form from a previous teacher, principal or guidance counselor; and an interview with a Concordia Academy administrator. Transcripts are also required; submit the "Request for Transcript" form to the previous school so they can release the transcript to Concordia. The applicant may also submit additional letters of recommendation from his/her pastor or youth director. Incoming freshmen also take placement exams prior to enrollment; these will be scheduled with the guidance counselor.

## Tuition Policies for Grades 7-12

- All families will be enrolled in the SMART tuition payment program unless full-tuition payment for the year accompanies the student's application. SMART assesses each family an additional \$38 administrative fee, payable in the first payment. The business office does not accept tuition payments.
- Tuition payments for the school year begin in August. Families wishing to pay monthly will be able to make 10 installments through automatic withdrawal from August to May of the following year.
- Late fees assessed by SMART will not be waived unless arrangements are made through the school office prior to the due date. The school is not responsible for any NSF charges incurred.
- Tuition must be current to begin classes, to continue enrollment, and to receive transcripts. Seniors who are not current may not be able to participate in graduation exercises.

### **Are there any income limits when applying for aid?**

### **When will I be notified if my student has been awarded assistance?**

### **Why am I submitting my application to FAIR?**

### **How do I apply?**

To begin the online application process parents should go to [www.fairapp.com](http://www.fairapp.com) and click on the "On-line Application" link. You can then create a user account using your email address and a password that you select. Once you have created a user account and signed in you will be able to complete the FAIR application on-line.

### **How will I know if FAIR has received my application?**

If you submit your application via mail you will receive a postcard from FAIR confirming receipt of your application.

If you submit your application online at [www.fairapp.com](http://www.fairapp.com) you will receive a confirmation page and a separate email confirming FAIR has received your application.

### **How do I fill out the application if I am a divorced, separated or single parent?**

If the dependents you list in Part II of the application will live primarily with you then you should complete the application form based on your income and household expenses. If you have remarried you will need to complete the application and include information about the stepparent's income, expenses, assets, and debt.

### **Who should I list in Part II Dependents?**

You should include all dependents currently living with you or for whom you are providing support. This includes older children attending college or any other relatives who are currently living with you to whom you are providing support.

CA-Bloomington is located one half-mile south of I-494 and Portland Avenue in Bloomington, Minnesota. The Concordia Academy Association of Schools has a second high school campus in Roseville, Minnesota.

## Standardized Scores

CA-Bloomington students taking the ACT Assessment during the last three academic years earned average composite scores greater than 24.5 (out of a possible 36). The state average for 2006-2007 was 22.5. The national average was 21. Typically, more than 90% of our students take the ACT or SAT exam.

## Advanced Schooling

100% of CA-Bloomington's 2006-2007 seniors are attending post-secondary institutions. 87% are attending a four-year college or university, and 13% are attending a two-year college, business, or specialized school.

## High School Graduation Requirements

A total of 25 credits is required for students graduating in 2008. Required credits include: theology (1 for each year in attendance), English (4), social studies (3), mathematics (2), science (2), additional credit in math or science (1), physical education and health (2), fine arts (1), foreign language (2), computer literacy (.5), and interim classes (.25 per year, totaling 1). The remaining credits are fulfilled through electives.

## Curriculum

CA-Bloomington is committed to providing superior Christian education. The school offers general academic and college preparatory programs, with a large majority of high school students pursuing a strong college prep program. The curriculum offers courses in core subjects, lab science, computers, advanced math, and fine arts. Some classes are offered on a rotating basis, others on an alternate year/semester basis, and some on demand. The junior high curriculum is departmentalized, with students traveling to different classrooms to learn from teachers in specific areas of expertise. Junior high students have the opportunity to take high school math, science, and Spanish classes. Qualifying high school students can earn high school and college credit simultaneously through the Post-Secondary Enrollment Option and Advanced Placement classes.
